Andrew Mason is Professor of Economics at the University of Hawaii and Senior Fellow in Population and Health Studies at the East-West Center. Professor Mason is the co-director of the National Transfer Account project, an international network of more than thirty-five countries developing a comprehensive approach for understanding the generational economy. National Transfer Accounts are being used to study the macroeconomic effects of changes in population age structure, the evolution of familial support systems, the varied roles of government, and the importance of financial markets to meeting the economic needs of children, youth, and the elderly. He is also a graduate faculty member in Global Health and Population Studies at the University of Hawaii and a member of the Center for the Economics and Demography of Ageing at the University of California, Berkeley. He holds Ph.D. and M.A. degrees in Economics from the University of Michigan.
