
The Fourth Committee held a total of 24 meetings, heard 121 statements in the general debates and also heard 31 petitioners. Following its consideration of all the items referred to it by the General Assembly, the Fourth Committee submitted to the Assembly eight

Falkland Islands (Malvinas), and six containing its recommendations on specific Territories and other related items. Seventeen of the 21 sets of recommendations contained in those reports were prepared by the Special Committee, in keeping with paragraph 31 of General Assembly decision 34/401; 14 recommendations were adopted by the Fourth Committee by consensus.




