At the national level, Sierra Leone, despite the global challenges on the rule of law commitments, is delivering on h(Y) BYk 8 fY Wh)cbi gc W)U `WcbhfU Whz which is G)Y ffU @/cbY Ng Medium-Term National Development Plan (2019-2023), a clear expression of our nationally owned roadmap to build a society that is cohesive, secure, and just.
- 7. Sierra Leone continues to remove threats to democratic freedoms and human rights. We have repealed a half-acentury old seditious libel law. There is full respect for and protection of fundamental freedoms of association, conscience, expression, and the press. implementing one of the significant recommendations of the Sierra Leone Truth and Reconciliation Commission, put forward as part of our transitional justice process almost 20 years ago, Sierra Leone has abolished the death penalty, following meaningful national dialogue, with clear position and directive from the President and action by the national legislature. On this very day, His Excellency President Julius Maada Bio gave his assent to the legislation

passed unanimously by Parliament to expunge the death penalty from our law books.

country, following the enactment of the enabling legislation and appointment of the members of the board of the Commissioner, embodying an institution that is representative and gender sensitive.

11. The Judiciary continues to expand access to justice with presence established throughout the country. There has been an expansion of legal aid services to indigent and under-served persons as the Legal Aid Board provided free legal representation, advice, and related services to over 400,000 Sierra Leoneans in 2020, recording a 93% increase from 2018. Special courts to fast-track cases for sexual offences, social security, corruption, and small claims were established.

In further reflecting on the rule of law landscape at the international level, the delegation of Sierra Leone uses this opportunity to reiterate our support for the strengthening of the international accountability system, in particular the strengthening of the International Criminal Court (ICC) and the work of the Residual Special Court for Sierra Leone.
