During its sessions the CEDAW Committee considers reports of States parties to the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women. Following such consideration. the **CEDAW** Committee formulates concluding comments that assist the State party in the further implementation of the Convention. These concluding comments contain positive aspects, principal subjects of concern and the Committee's recommendations on how to address challenges faced by the State party.
